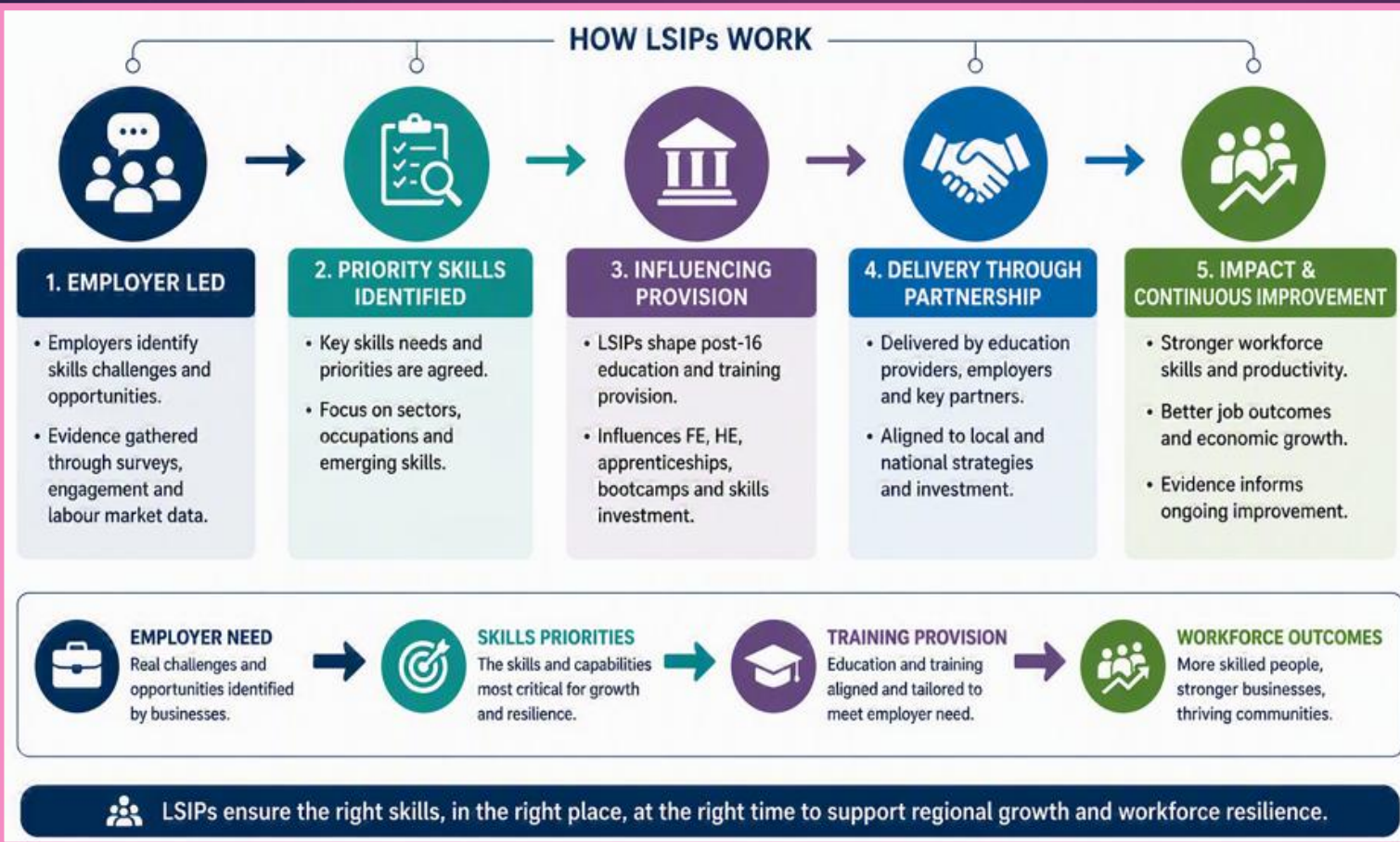


What are Local Skills Improvement Plans (LSIPs)?

KEY MESSAGE: LSIPs are the Government's employer-led mechanism for identifying local skills priorities and influencing post-16 education and training provision.



THE REASONS 'WHY' LSIPs MATTER TO NORTHERN NUCLEAR ALLIANCE (NNA) MEMBERS:

- They provide evidence of skills demand, which comes directly from employers
- They highlight regional workforce challenges that affect many sectors, including the nuclear sector
- They offer an opportunity for industry to influence future skills provision in their regions, and
- They help to align workforce planning – including within the nuclear sector – with wider regional and national priorities.

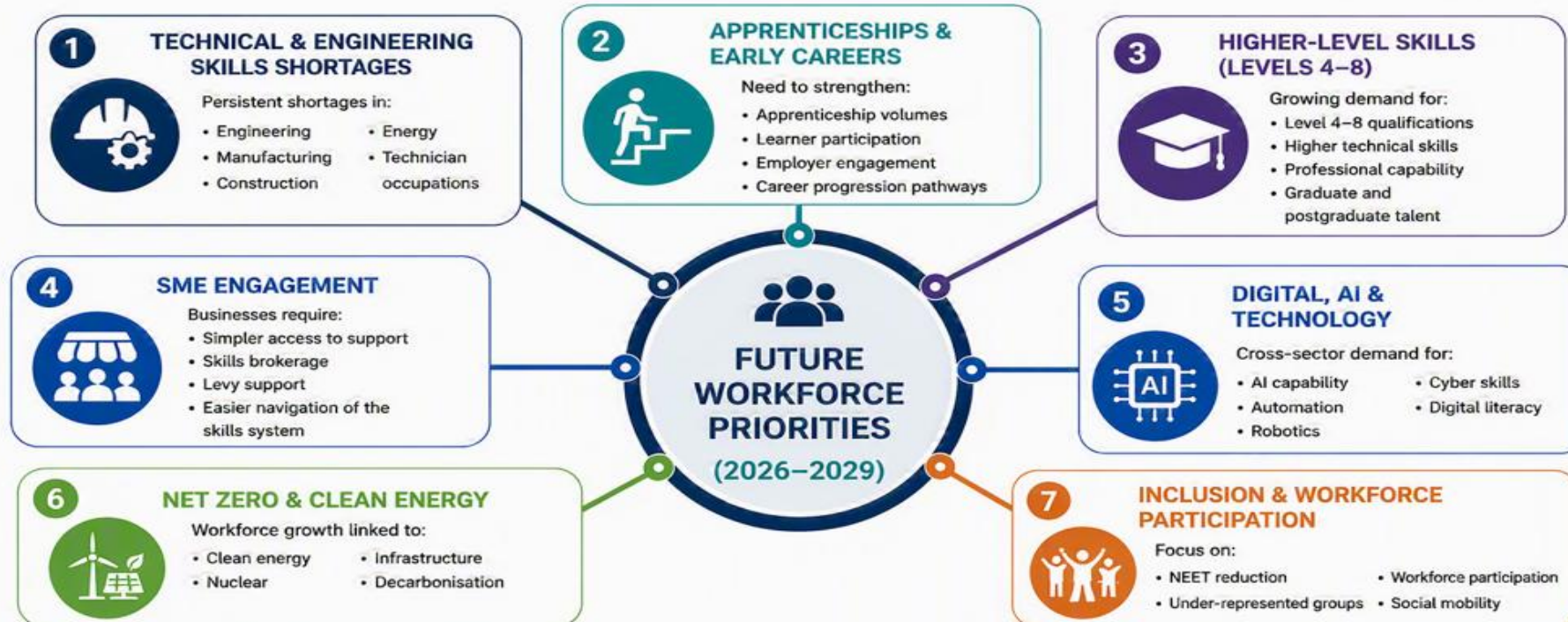

— Despite different economic profiles, both LSIPs identify remarkably consistent workforce and skills challenges. —

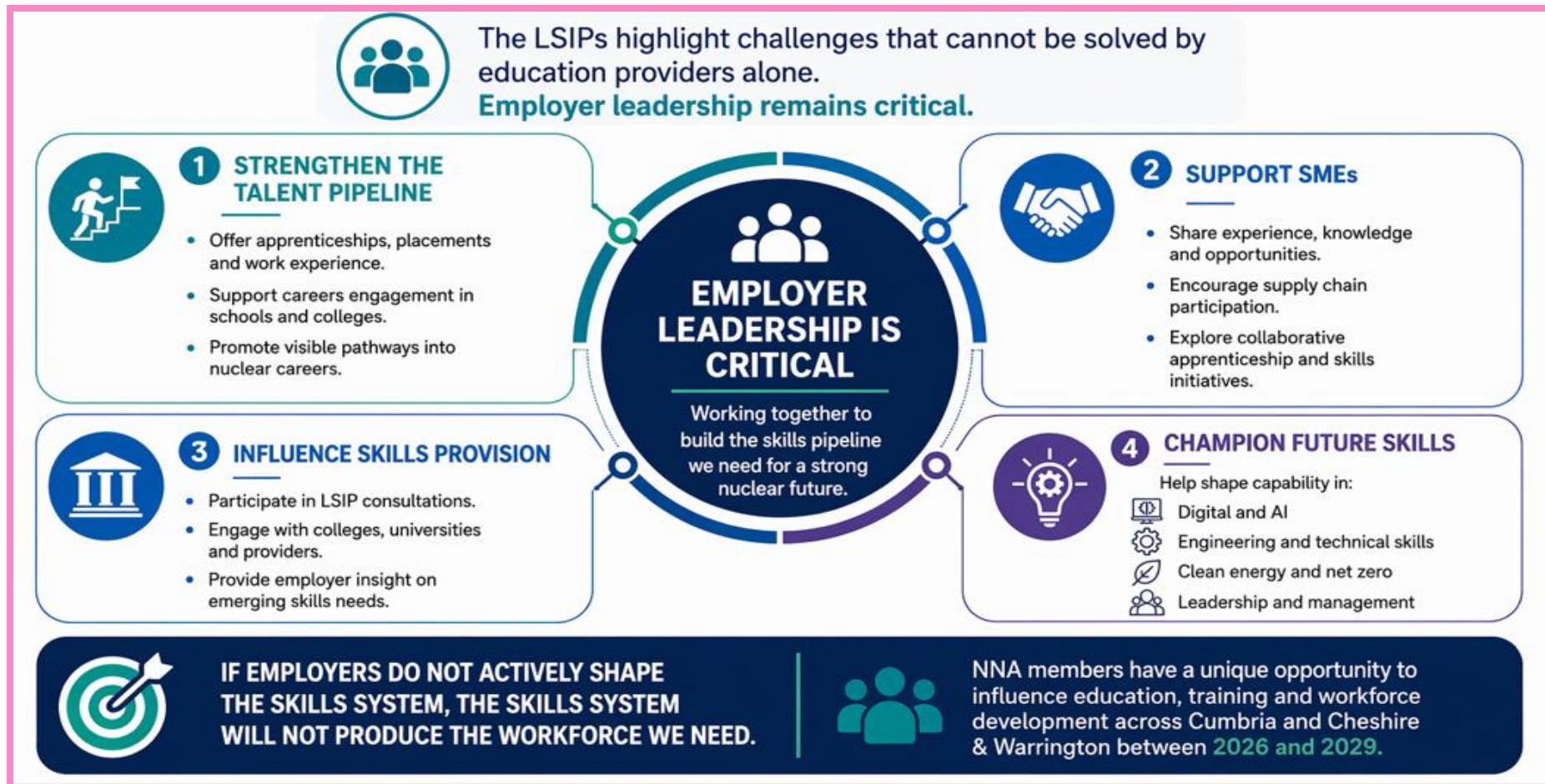
